From the Vestry: Warden Update

I have to admit it is taking me some time to develop my role as Warden. The hard reality hit when Elizabeth handed me a large set of keys and Abbie reminded me that I had to sign her timesheet twice a month. I have had discussions with Fr. Ed and Fr. Michael regarding their work as part-time ministers and I plan to continue those discussions in the future.

The Vestry is moving forward with some of the initiatives that we identified at our retreat in February. These include being sure that our church building and grounds are in good repair, continuing Messy Church, improving our mics and Zoom recordings, increasing visibility on Facebook and now Instagram, better "advertising" of events using banners and signs, and having events outside of our church to increase our visibility and increase contacts with people in the community (e.g. Summer in the Park and the Good Friday walk).

This Sunday's Gospel: John 15:1-18

Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you.



Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

in Manchester, to raise money for Meals Matter, a United Way sponsored student-led organization.

Meals Matter is committed to eliminating food insecurity in the Nashua School District. The program provides financial support for students who struggle with school lunch debt, whether they are free, reduced or full-pay students. Last year, six students rappelled off the building and raised \$5,000. This year they have a team of six students and a team of six adults. United Way is the fiscal agent, but all funds raised go directly to the Meals Matter program.

Meet our Outreach recipients

Church of Our Saviour's outreach grants traditionally are made possible thanks to our various fundraisers and in-gatherings, Charitable Trust grants, designated gifts, and allocations by the vestry to outreach from Christmas Fair proceeds and year-end surpluses.

Your Outreach Committee thought parishioners would find it interesting to learn more about recipients of our outreach grants. You no doubt know that SHARE is a long-standing beneficiary, but do you know that there are more than 10 other worthy charities we support as we seek to extend God's love to those in need? In the coming months, we'll briefly highlight a different recipient each week.

Family Promise

One of our regular grant recipients is Family Promise of Southern New Hampshire (**FPSNH**), which began in 2000 as the **Greater Nashua Interfaith Hospitality Network**, with the goal of helping homeless families achieve sustainable independence. Local congregations hosted families on a rotating basis. Church of Our Saviour was involved early on, helping provide meals and overnight volunteers during weeks when families stayed at the United Methodist Church across the street from us. In 2002, families were able to stop moving around week to week and stay at their "home for now" at Anne-Marie House in Hudson. In 2021, FPSNH doubled its capacity by moving to the former Infant Jesus School in Nashua where they can now accommodate 24 families!

FPSNH works with families of all configurations who are homeless, providing transitional housing and helping adults set goals, resolve problems, build up savings, and acquire financial literacy and other skills to break the cycle of homelessness and enhance prospects for success, self-sufficiency, and resiliency. FPSNH has worked with more than 300 families since their start, and has a success rate of over 80 percent. So many lives transformed!!

SHARE Collection April 27

Church of Our Saviour will be at Market Basket this Saturday, April 27, from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. to collect food and personal care items for SHARE. The Outreach committee and other volunteers will set up a table set up outside the main entrance



with signage letting folks know who we are and what we are doing. We'll give shoppers a list of needed items as they head inside, then collect donated items, gift cards, or cash/checks on their way out, and deliver everything to SHARE that afternoon. Look for us Saturday when you do your shopping and help spread the word.

SHARE's food donations 'down to a trickle'

Please continue to keep SHARE in mind each week as you shop. Right now, food donations are down to a trickle, according to Executive Director Chris Janson, and SHARE must purchase food to provide groceries to more than 100 clients each week.

Outreach has therefore re-started the "reverse offering" where slips of paper with a category of item needed by SHARE will be distributed with the Sunday bulletin, asking parishioners to bring that item in the next time they are at church.

You can drop these items in the basket in the church Narthex, take items directly to SHARE (1 Columbus Ave., Milford, Monday through Friday, 8:30-4:30), leave them in barrels at Shaw's or Market Basket in Milford, or Bar Harbor Bank & Trust (32 Elm St., Milford), or donate online via their <u>Amazon</u> <u>Wishlist</u>.

Thank you for your ongoing support to this vital community organization providing food, clothing and emergency financial assistance to area families in need.
